

PREPARING HOUESEHOLD HAZARDOUS MATERIALS FOR A FLOOD EVENT

How do I safely store household hazardous products?

- Store all hazardous products on high shelves or in locked cabinets away from food item
- Make sure the lids and caps are tightly sealed.
- Store corrosive, flammable, reactive, and poisonous products on separate shelves and where will stay dry
- □ Keep products in their original containers and make sure the labels are clearly legible.
- □ For long-term storage, place waterproof transparent tape over the product labels for protection.
- □ Keep products away from heat, sparks, flames, or sources of ignition.
- □ Never mix chemicals together to save storage space.
- Keep an inventory of the products you have so you do not buy more than you need.
- Properly dispose of unwanted or no longer needed hazardous products at your local Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHW). Find an HHW in your area at http://www.wmr.saccounty.net/HHW-**Dropoff-Centers.aspx**
