Introduction

EMD, as the Sacramento County Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) received, reviewed, and approved an application to revise L and D Landfill's Report of Disposal Site Information (RDSI)/Joint Technical Document (JTD). The LEA is certified by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (**CalRecycle**) to enforce state laws and regulations at solid waste sites within the County and City of Sacramento, including all active and closed landfills.

Description of project and LEA's determination

L and D Landfill is a solid waste disposal site located at 8635 Fruitridge Rd. Sacramento CA 95826. On October 2, 2017, the LEA received a Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP) application package to amend the RDSI/JTD from L and D Landfill Limited Partnership.

Revisions to the facility's RDSI include: edits to address changes in the facility's parcel information, relocation of the Material Recovery Facility (MRF) within the landfill, correction of inaccurate MRF-related information and the proposed acceptance for off-site transfer of curbside collected household generated waste motor oil, oil filters, and waste cooking oil.

The LEA determined that the proposed acceptance of waste cooking oil conflicts with the terms and conditions of the SWFP and would require a permit revision. However, the other proposed changes were found to be consistent with all applicable certified California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents, and the applicable State Minimum Standards, and do not conflict with the terms and conditions in the current SWFP. These changes qualified as RFI amendments. The LEA therefore partially accepted the RFI amendment on October 24, 2017, requiring the operator to remove the reference to the acceptance of waste cooking oil from the RDSI/JTD.
