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**PUBLIC NOTICE: GROUNDWATER CLEANUP PROJECT AT
PG&E SACRAMENTO SERVICE CENTER,
5555 FLORIN PERKINS ROAD, SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA**




Figure 1 – Site Location Map – 5555 Florin Perkins Road, Sacramento, California

Public Notice: Sacramento County Environmental Management Department (SCEMD) invites public comment on a request for regulatory closure, made on behalf of Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), for the former leaking underground storage tank (LUST) site at 5555 Florin Perkins Road, Sacramento, Sacramento County, California. A map showing the location of the Site is attached (Figure 1).

CASE SUMMARY:

The approximately 16-acre site is an active utility service center, which provides construction, operation, and maintenance services to PG&E's electrical and natural gas customers. In December 2002, petroleum impacted soil was discovered during a fuel dispenser upgrade and was removed from beneath the dispenser. Soil and groundwater investigations have been conducted at the site between July 2003 and the present. From 2004 to 2010, additional cleanup was conducted using soil vapor extraction and approximately 11,700 pounds of petroleum hydrocarbons were removed by the system. Groundwater monitoring has been conducted at the site since 2003 to evaluate groundwater flow, groundwater quality, and the extent of residual petroleum hydrocarbons. Although the initial soil and groundwater samples collected from the site contained elevated concentrations of residual petroleum hydrocarbons, concentrations in groundwater have decreased dramatically over time and only very low concentrations remain. The residual petroleum hydrocarbons are expected to degrade naturally without migrating much farther beyond the current limits of the contaminant groundwater plume within a reasonable timeframe. Therefore, the residual petroleum hydrocarbons are unlikely to pose a threat to human health or further affect waters of the State as they continue to degrade beneath the site.

SCEMD staff conducted a review of PG&E's request for regulatory closure for the site, and based on the data presented, believes there is merit to the request. All public comments will be considered prior to closing the site.
