

Beyond the Blueprint

Effective June 15, 2021

As of June 15, 2021 all sectors listed in the current Blueprint and Business Tier Chart may return to usual operations (with the limited exceptions noted below for Mega Events based on the general public health recommendations below).

Currently, face covering guidance requires unvaccinated residents wear face coverings in indoor places. On July 15, 2021, due to the increase cases of COVID-19, the Sacramento County Public Health Officer strongly recommends vaccinated residents (general public) also wear face masks in indoor settings **where vaccination verification is not required and the vaccination status of others is unknown.**

Mega Event: characterized by large crowds **greater than 5,000 (indoors) and 10,000 (outdoor) attendees.** May have either assigned or unassigned seating, and may be either general admission, or gated, ticketed and permitted events.

The requirements and recommendations for negative testing / vaccine verification will be in place effective **June 15, 2021 through October 1, 2021.** The state will **assess conditions by September 1, 2021,** to determine whether updated requirements or recommendations are needed beyond October 1, 2021. **Guidance is continually assessed and subject to change.**

**Cal OSHA Emergency

 COVID-19 ETS**

Thursday June 17, 2021: Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board adopted their revisions (highlights below) of the COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards for vaccinated and unvaccinated workers. The Governor signed an Executive Order which codified the revision and bypassed the 10 day OAL process.

Definitions:

Face Covering (section 3205(b)(8)): means a surgical mask, a medical procedure mask, a respirator worn voluntarily, or a tightly woven fabric or non-woven material of at least two layers. A face covering has no visible holes or openings and must, which covers the nose and mouth. A face covering does not include a scarf, ski mask, balaclava, bandana, turtleneck, collar, or single layer of fabric.

Fully Vaccinated Employee (section 3205(b)(9)): employer has documented that the person has received, **at least 14 days prior**, the second dose in a two dose series or a single dose of COVID-19 vaccine. Must be FDA approved, emergency use authorization from FDA, or, for persons fully vaccinated outside the UST, be listed for emergency use by the World Health Organization (WHO).

Employers may document (keep records confidential) by one of the acceptable options:

- Employee can self- attest – Employer keeps record who self-attests.
- Employee can provide proof of vaccination. Employer keeps a record who provided proof but does not actually keep vaccine record.
- Employees can provide proof of vaccination and employer maintains a copy.
